**Importance of Language Development in Early Childhood** **Language Development**. Figure 1. Reading to young children helps them develop language skills by hearing and using new vocabulary words. A child's vocabulary expands between the ages of two to six from about 200 words to over 10,000 words through a process called fast-mapping . Words are easily learned by making connections between new words and concepts already known.

**Language Development in Early Childhood** **Lifespan Development** **During infancy and early childhood, the ability to understand and use language goes through rapid change. Some psychologists even take the view that speaking to your unborn child supports language development and communication. There are many developmental milestones that demonstrate the significant changes that occur within language development.**

**Language Development During Infancy and Early Childhood** **During early childhood, children's abilities to understand, to process, and to produce language also flourish in an amazing way. Young children experience a language explosion between the ages of 3 and 6. At age 3, their spoken vocabularies consist of roughly 900 words. By age 6, spoken vocabularies expand dramatically to anywhere between 8,000 and 14,000 words.**

**Early Childhood Cognitive Development: Language** **A new study finds that a home environment that supports language development in early childhood—across the first four years of life—predicts children's readiness to learn in pre-school, which in turn predicts the children's academic skills in fifth grade (age 10-11). The study focused on low-income families.**
